Year in Review: ACT Foundation Supports Education and Charities in 2013

In its inaugural year of 2013, the Account Control Technology Foundation awarded \$50,000 in scholarships to support college education, as well as \$21,052.55 in funds to charitable organizations.

Charities supported by the ACT Foundation in 2013 included the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life in Bakersfield, CA (\$5,515); the Concho Valley Regional Food Bank in San Angelo, TX (\$2.118.55); the Arbor Day Foundation (\$1,429); the American Red Cross tornado relief fund (\$1,000); and the Susan G. Komen organization (\$10,990). The donations were provided as matching funds to monies raised by employees of Account Control Technology, Inc. One highlight was the donation to Susan G. Komen in support of breast cancer awareness and research, since the Foundation's contribution was part of a \$31,980 total donation to the charity, given at the organization's headquarters in Dallas, TX (see photo).

Another highlight of the year was the motorcycle trek to the Arctic Circle by Dale Van Dellen, chairman of the ACT Foundation. Dale's 4,000+ mile journey from Los Angeles, CA to Deadhorse, AK in June raised more than \$10,000 toward the Foundation's scholarship programs.
