2014 Year in Review: ACT Foundation Continues Support for Education and Charities

In 2014, the Account Control Technology Foundation awarded \$50,000 in scholarships to support college education, as well as \$22,359.75 in funds to charitable organizations. In October, the Foundation launched its first financial literacy/financial wellness campaign through the introduction of its “Beware the Debt Monster” messaging on posters sent to hundreds of colleges and universities nationwide. Charities supported by the ACT Foundation in 2014 included the American Cancer Society’s Relay for Life in Bakersfield, CA (\$2,470); Project Graduation in San Angelo, TX (\$2,500); Boys & Girls of the West Valley (\$750); the North Texas Food Bank (\$1,132.75); and the Susan G. Komen organization (\$15,507). The donations were provided as matching funds to monies raised by employees of Account Control Technology, Inc. (ACT). The Foundation’s donation to Susan G. Komen was part of a \$32,014 total donation to the charity, given at the organization’s headquarters in Dallas, TX.

The ACT Foundation was established by Dale Van Dellen and his wife, Debbie, to build financial literacy, support education, fund vital charities and provide community support.
